Creating an account:

You must set up an account with *LearningExpress.com* in order to take exams and courses. Registration is free with your Dundee Public Library card. To set up an account you simply click on the “Register” button under the New Users heading on the welcome page (it is on the bottom towards the center).

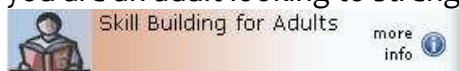

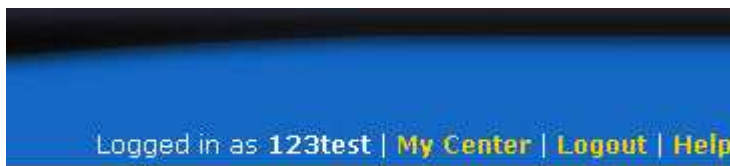
