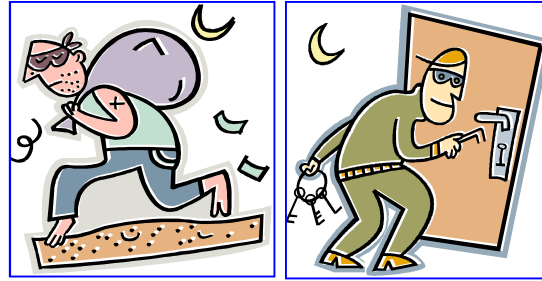
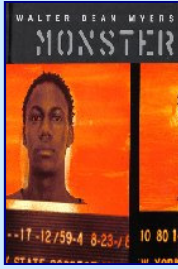


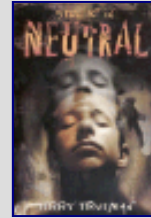
Monster by Walter Dean Myers

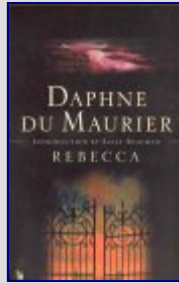
Stuck in Neutral by Terry Trueman

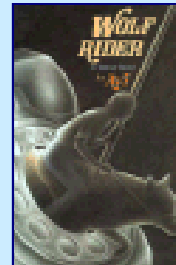
Rebecca by Daphne Du Maurier

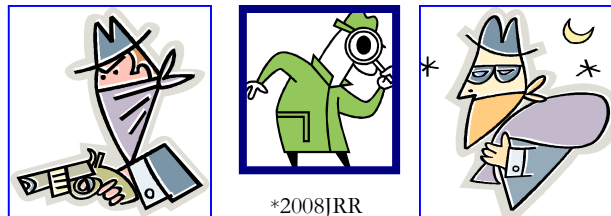
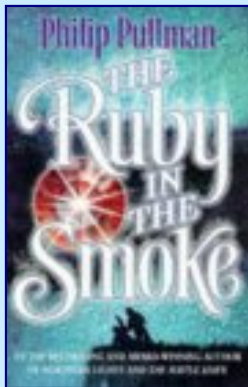
Wolf Rider: A Tale of Terror by Avi

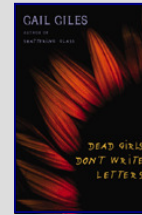
Acceleration by Graham McNamee

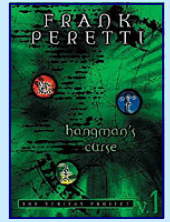
Dead Girls Don't Write Letters by Gail Giles

Mary Russell, a Victorian young lady, teams up with the legendary Sherlock Holmes to become his partner-in-training.



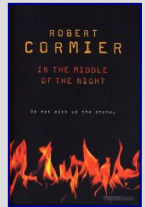
Face on The Milk Carton by Caroline Cooney

Torey Adams, a high school junior with a seemingly perfect life, struggles with doubts and questions surrounding the disappearance of the class out-cast.

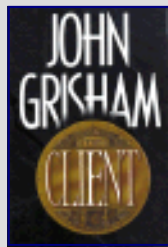


Friends to Die For by Jane Sughrue Gillberga

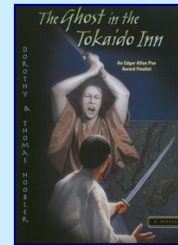
The Client by John Grisham

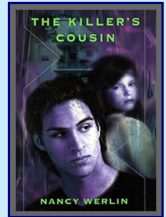
The Ghost in the Tokaido Inn by Dorothy Hoobler
