DIGITAL MAGAZINES ARE FINALLY HERE!

Since 1998 NLS has been distributing audio magazines on cassettes. Now that the analog-based talking-book program has been replicated with a digital one, NLS is preparing to send audio magazines to patrons on digital cartridges. Some aspects of the magazine on cartridge MOC program will be similar to the magazine on cassette program, but many will be new and will take some getting used to by magazine subscribers. Audio magazine readers may find more than one magazine title on a cartridge. They will need to use the bookshelf mode in the digital player to access their magazines. Cartridges containing more than one magazine will include an initial message giving instructions on using the bookshelf.

Each patron's delivery schedule will be different as it depends on the magazines to which he/she is subscribed. MOC will determine a "trigger" magazine for each patron. A trigger magazine is defined as the magazine that will cause the contractor to send a cartridge to a patron. The trigger magazine for each patron is carefully chosen to optimize the timeliness of the cartridge and the magazines that it contains.

Consider, for example, if patron 12345 subscribes to four magazines: People, Good Housekeeping, Talking Book Topics, and National Geographic. MOC has determined that the trigger magazine for patron 12345 is People, because it is a weekly publication. When a new issue of People becomes available on BARD, MOC will create the picking list, which the contractor will retrieve when it commences the duplication session. The picking list will contain entries for patron 12345 specifying the issues of the four magazines (People, Good Housekeeping, Talking Book Topics, and National Geographic) to be copied to a cartridge and sent to the patron. Note that *Good Housekeeping* and *National Geographic* are monthly publications and *Talking Book Topics* is a bimonthly publication. So patron 12345 should receive a cartridge every week. Some weeks it will only have *People* on it; some weeks it will have *People* and any combination of the other three magazines that have new issues available. Audio magazine readers may receive different magazines on a cartridge each month.

For example, in January, February, and March patron 12345 receives a cartridge with Consumer Reports, Good Housekeeping, and National Geographic on it. In April she receives a cartridge with Consumer Reports and Good Housekeeping on it because National Geographic was more than one week late. In May she receives a cartridge with Consumer Reports, Good Housekeeping, and two issues (the April and May) of National Geographic on it.

Audio magazine readers must return cartridges to the contractor by flipping the mailing card affixed to the outside of the red magazine mailing container and dropping it in the mail. Patrons will also be receiving an order form to fill out. The completed order form should be submitted in person or by mail to the Virgin Islands Regional Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped.



HOW TO USE BOOKSHELF



TO READ CARTRIDGES WITH MULTIPLE BOOKS GO TO "BOOKSHELF" MODE


1. Insert cartridge in player



2. To enter bookshelf mode press and hold "Play/Stop" for four seconds or till you hear the word "Bookshelf".



3. Press Rewind/Fast Forward to select book

The Virgin Islands Regional Library has been in the Virgin Islands since 1968 and was started in St. Thomas. It was relocated to St. Croix first in Frederiksted and then Christiansted at its present location in 1992. The Library is part of the Library of Congress Network of the Libraries for Blind and Physically Handicapped Individuals. It provides audiotaped books and cassettes free of charge to persons who are unable to utilize traditional books. More recently the Library has transitioned to the digital age with the introduction of digital players and books. The Library of Congress/National Library Service came into existence in 1931 for blind residents in the U.S. but over the years has expanded its scope and size.

Our local administrative agency is the Division of Libraries, Archives and Museums in the Department of Planning and National Resources, Government of the U.S. Virgin Islands.
